

So you want to be a Deconstruction Volunteer?

Here are some basics about volunteering with the Habitat ReStore Deconstruction program.

- Volunteering with the Deconstruction team consists of helping to salvage useable & sellable materials from buildings typically slated for demolition.
- Typical tasks include helping remove kitchen cabinets, removing doors & windows, taking up flooring, & removing electrical fixtures.
- Deconstruction volunteers are expected to provide their own lunch, work gloves (if you have them) and transportation to and from the site.
- Tools and safety equipment if necessary will be provided.
- Hours vary, but are typically from 8:30 am to 3:30pm.
- Our scheduling varies as the need arises, and can be on short notice.
- Requirements are a willingness to learn and energy to perform this physical task. Deconstruction volunteer will be expected to move, lift and load sometimes heavy items.
- Prior experience in construction or deconstruction is helpful but not necessary.
